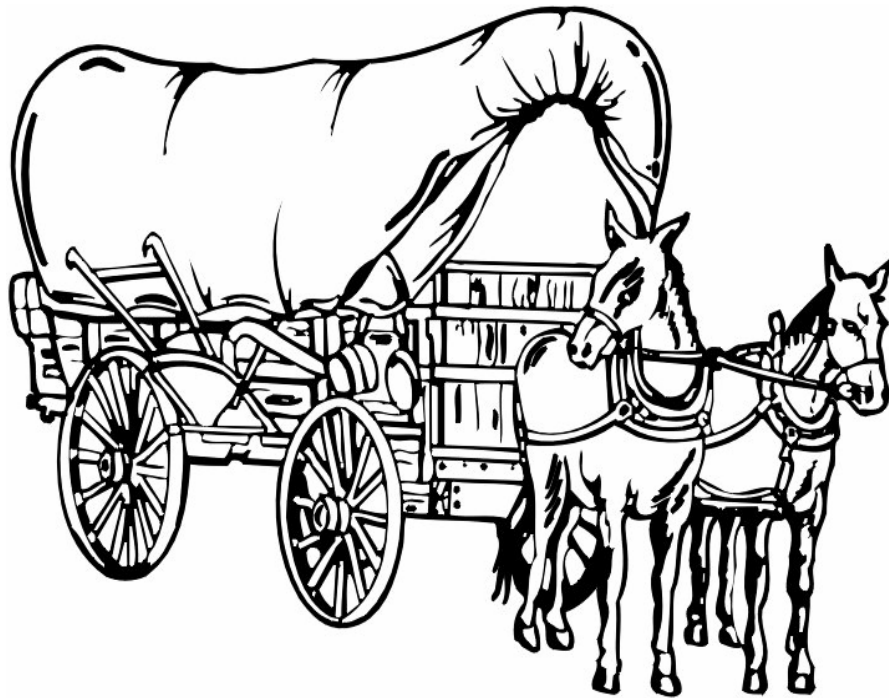


CIRCLE THE WAGONS FOR CUB SCOUTING



The Great Cardinal District's Chuckwagon Derby Oct. 22-23, 2005

What is a Chuckwagon Derby? It is an event that a Den pulls a covered wagon from station to station while doing different skills. The wagon can be as simple as a regular child's wagon with an arched cover like in the picture above. Some packs have home made wooden wagons that they made some time ago for past Chuckwagon Derbies.

You can get some ideas from the "How to Book" and from going to Google and searching for "Cub Scout Chuckwagon Derby Plans". Try to make your wagons as authentic as possible since we will have a contest for the best looking.

You will need to bring a bag lunch to have on the trail while you go from station to station. Your wagons will need to have some materials in them to use at some of the stations. A list of these materials will follow.

There could be bandits that will check your wagons for the supplies that is on the list and can take away some Gold Nuggets. So, Make sure that you have the materials on the list.

We will have many different stations for your scouts to do.

1. Dead Eye Station: BB, Archery, and Sling Shot Ranges
2. Catching Food Station: Fishing
3. Claim Jumping Station: Geology
4. Medicine Man Station: First Aid
5. Critter Walk Station: Nature Hike
6. Ledge Walking Station: Physical Fitness
7. Hang Man Station: Knot Tying
8. Field Tracking Station: Field Games
9. Hide Tanning Station: Leather Craft
10. Trading Post

**PACK REGISTRATION PACKET – DUE NO LATER
THAN OCTOBER 14, 2005**

The following forms make up the Pack Registration Packet: **(1) Pack Roll Up Form; (2) Family Registration Form**, (1 form per family); **(3) Pack T-Shirt Order Form with Worksheet; (4) Class I Medical Form**, (one per BSA registered youth, leader and family campers); **(5) Local Tour Permit Application** (Tour permits are to come with the unit to camp.) Please use the enclosed forms as they are designed to provide quick and accurate accounting of the participants necessary for camp material purchases and T-shirt orders. The pack is to supply the Health forms and the Tour permit form.

- To ensure your T-shirts are in place for pick up at registration time on October 22, the Pack T-shirt order form Packet **MUST be in to Council no later than end of business on Oct. 14, 2005. All fees or payments for T-shirts must be made no later than end of business on Oct. 14, 2005 in order to guarantee T-shirt delivery on Oct. 22th.**
- To comply with BSA policy, all Cub Scouts and registered leaders and family members must submit a Class I Medical Form, or a copy, along with the Pack Registration Packet **no later than end of business on Oct. 15, 2004. Incomplete or missing forms must be completed day of registration. Medical forms can be brought to camp with you, but it is better to have already turned them in with the registration.**
- **T-shirt orders will not taken after end of business on October 14, 2005. After Oct. 14, 2005, make sure that your pack's check is only for REGISTRATION because the extra funds that are included on your pack's check will be placed into your pack's account at the council office.**
- To comply with BSA policy, please submit a Local Tour Permit Application to Council Headquarters by October 14, 2005 and bring it with you to the event we will collect them there.

REGISTRATION – DAY OF THE EVENT

Prior to the arrival of your pack, we request your pack representative report to the Welcome Center, between 7:30 AM and 8:30 AM to:

- Finalize the pack/den roster and make last minute additions and payments.
- Provide required Class I Medical Forms for late registrants.
- Select and register the pack Campsite, for quick location of participants in case of emergency.
- Pick up, inventory, inspect, and sign for camp T-shirts.
- Turn in the Tour permit.

TIP – Reporting leaders should have a copy of your pack’s consolidated T-shirt order to verify issued T-shirts meet your requested order

T-shirts will be signed for by the tour leader to ensure each pack receives their requested order. Take an immediate inventory and inspection to ensure quality and quantity.

Any T-shirts not used for shortages or damaged goods will be placed on sale after 12:01 PM on Oct. 22, and may be purchased at the camp trading post.

Walk-ins are welcomed, but there is no guarantee T-shirts will be available for purchase. Registration forms and Class I Medical Forms will be available at the Welcome Center.

UNIFORM

YOUTH – The official uniform for this event, for Cub and WEBELOS Scouts is as follows: blue Cub shirt or the tan Webelos shirt with appropriate accessories (neckerchief, slide, belt and belt buckle). The event T-shirt may be substituted.

ADULT LEADERS – Registered adult leaders are to wear the Official Scout Uniform. Wearing the complete uniform is encouraged. Event T-shirt is optional.

PARKING

GENERAL: Vehicles are allowed to park in parking lot areas only. Since we are at the Cub & Webelos Adventure Camp all parking will be in the parking lot and in the grass field above the parking lot. All roads must remain open for Emergency Vehicles at all times. We will have Unloading passes for your pack to use to unload your vehicles. This pass is just for the time it takes to unload your vehicle, not for setting up camp. Please help to make this happen. The registered leaders are responsible for policing vehicles belonging to parents associated with their pack.

We strongly encourage that each pack “Car Pool” their equipment into the camping area. We cannot handle the hundreds of vehicles that will want to be in the camping area. **Since there is a major event in the Cub Adventure Camp on Oct.21, we can not have early setup and drop off of equipment.**

Movement restrictions placed on vehicles will be lifted after Sunday Service at 8:30AM.

TIP - For those who wish to leave Saturday or early Sunday, please park in the General Parking Area out front of the Welcome Center.

ISSUE: The terrain and the grounds of the Cub and Webelos Adventure Camp was set up for program areas and not for parking off the gravel road. Thus the roads are narrow and you need to unload and move your vehicle back to the parking lot. Please respect our concern for your safety and help us to protect your Cubs and family by parking in designated areas.

SHUTTLE: After 11AM, arriving campers will shuttle den and pack cargo/supplies around the camp gate. A shuttle tractor with trailer will provide on demand service after 11AM. You may bring a cart, wheelbarrow, or wagon to facilitate arrival into the camp.

TIP – Have the pack’s and individual equipment and supplies loaded onto a few vehicles, which accompanies the reporting pack leader in the early morning. This will ensure equipment is moved into the camping area as quickly as possible, with the least inconvenience.

HANDICAPPED PARKING - Requests for special parking passes for medical conditions will be made on a case-by-case basis. Special passes must be requested in advance and will be issued on the day of the event. We prefer to discuss the request prior to Oct. 14 to allow for the greatest degree of accommodation. Every reasonable effort will be made to accommodate those with physical disabilities or special needs.

Activities will begin when vehicles are out of camping areas, parked, and secured in designated parking areas.

CAMPING

- Campers are responsible for the following:
 - Water for washing, cooking, & cleaning up (Water is available in Camp)
 - Menu selection, preparation and storage (Your pack/ Den will cook your own meals.)
 - Trash removal from Cub and Webelos Adventure Camp
 - Campsite cleanup to include firewood removal from fire stands and campsites
 - Camp safety and adherence to BSA policy found in “Guide to Safe Scouting”

CAMPFIRES

- **ALL CAMPFIRES WILL USE RAISED FIRE STANDS FOR PACK CAMPFIRES OR IN THE FIRE RINGS THAT ARE IN SOME CAMP SITES**
- Bonfires are not permitted, but campfires contained within raised fire stands are or in the Fire rings in some camp sites.
- Depending on local fire conditions, additional restrictions may be imposed.

- Firewood brought in from an outside source is recommended; however, on site deadfall may be used.
- There is to be NO digging of fire pits.
- A Campfire has to be monitored at all times by adults.

GENERAL CONCERNS

- **Vehicle Speed** – Drivers must exercise **EXTREME** caution when operating motor vehicles on camp property. Cubs are there to have fun in a vehicle free environment. Once vehicles are parked, vehicles should stay parked until after Sunday morning services are concluded.
- **IN-CAMP SPEED LIMIT IS 5 MPH or the speed of a walking person.**
- Passengers are not allowed to ride in back of pickup trucks without seats equipped with safety belts.
- **Pets are not welcomed on all camp properties during the duration of this camp.** Service animals will be permitted, but must be discussed in advance.
- Please, no sheath knives, (this includes adults).
- Given the number of young campers, camp saws or hatchets are not permitted.
- Tent trenching is not allowed.
- Open flames in tents are prohibited. Please use flashlights within tents.
- Liquid fuels, such as charcoal starter, or “white gas” are not permitted in camp, nor is propane allowed in tents. However, “Coleman” type cook stove fuel is allowed when used and stored with caution. Where charcoal is used, please use self-starting brands.
- Firearms and fireworks are not allowed in camp.
- Radios and electronic devices are strongly discouraged. The staff uses the same type of radios that you have and if we can’t communicate when there is an issue there could be a safety issue. Remember the life you save might be your own.
- Alcoholic beverages and illegal substances are not permitted.
- Secure and store foods to prevent attracting little furry friends.

Trading Post - All sorts of “Scout Stuff” will be available for purchase along with soft drinks and snacks.

Fishing Derby - This year’s fishing derby is open to all Scouts. Register and enter as many fish as you like. A fishing clinic will run along with the derby to offer fishing tips and assist Cubs in earning achievements and electives, along with the fishing belt loop and pin. Approximately fifty rods/reels will be available for use by Scouts. Cub scouts are not required to possess a Virginia Fishing License, however any participant over 16 years old, is required to possess a Virginia Freshwater Fishing License. A parent must accompany Cubs at all times while fishing. Bring your own favorite fishing bait to the fishing station. The winner will be announced at the campfire.

TIP – Bring your fishing pole and bait (bread, corn, live, etc.) and fish as early as you like. Remember to register in the derby at the Fishing Station and use a gallon zip lock bag available at the fishing station to keep your catches alive.

Projects

Projects will be available to siblings to do based on their skill level but, the projects are set up for Cub Scout skill levels.

- Leather Crafts
- Rock Collections

Skills

- Tree ID – Identify trees by their bark (not their bite), leaves
- Leaf collection – Start a leaf collection
- Nature Game

Range Activities

- **BB Range** - This event is open to all scouts from Tigers to WEBELOS. You may visit this station as many times as you want.
- **Archery Range** - This event is open to all scouts from Tigers to WEBELOS. And you may visit this station as many times as you want.
- **Sling Shot Range** - This event is open to all scouts from Tigers to WEBELOS.

PLEASE PLACE ON TOP OF PACKET AS FIRST SHEET

- Camp fees are \$8.00 per scout and adult, \$6.00 per siblings and sibling under 4 years of age is \$4.00 each. Siblings are invited to participate, adults, registered leaders or not, but are invited to share the fun with their children.
- The Pack Roll up Form must accompany individual registration forms as a cover sheet, summarizing the request for camping space and T-shirts. No T-shirt will be granted after the Oct. 14, 2005 registration deadline.
- T-shirt costs are indicated on the order form. Indicate your “**NO ORDER**” on the Pack Roll Up for T-shirts if this should be the case.
- A Class I Medical Form is required for each registered youth and registered adult leader and all campers at registration, on or before Oct. 14.
- **Please have a pack leader confirm your registration prior to your pack’s arrival, on Oct. 22 between 7:30 and 8:30 AM. Confirmation involves:**
 - Finalize the pack/den roster and make last minute additions & payments.
 - Provide required Class I Medical Forms for late registrants.
 - Select and register the pack campsite, for quick location in case of emergency.
 - Pick up, inventory, inspect, and sign for camp T-shirts.
 - Identify special concerns or request special considerations.
- Please include the total amount for the T-shirt order in the check you pay to Council, at registration on, or before, Oct. 14, 2005. Remember NO T-shirt orders will be taken after Oct. 14, 2005.
- **Each pack must keep their own list of participants who ordered T-shirts and is also responsible for inventorying and distributing their T-shirts upon receipt.**
- Any extra T-shirts will be sold after 2:00 PM, October 22 , 2005.
